PUNCTUALITY

Having good attendance also means being on time and not being late to school. Students who arrive late can feel embarrassed, left out and miss out on important introductions to lessons. Punctuality is an essential life skill that needs to be taught from the very beginning.

While punctuality will promote learning, arriving late to school can also be very disruptive for your child, the teacher, and the other students in the class.

Last term, we saw an increase in lateness and parents were notified and when necessary, punctuality contracts were issued to help improve punctuality.

Late detention explained:

Level 1: 20 minutes on Friday after school (2 lates within the same week)

Level 2: 1 hour on Friday after school (3 lates within the same week)

Level 3: 2 hours detention on Saturday morning (3 Level 2 within a half term)
